

Update your Home Address & Phone Number! The license law requires you to keep your home address and phone number updated with the Commission at all times. You have 10 days after a change to update your information. It's easy and there is no charge – just log in to the online services at www.irec.idaho.gov and type in the correct information on the "My Account" screen. Save your changes and you are done!

The Commission wastes an inordinate amount of your license fees mailing out renewal notices, law books, and other items that are either returned to us or discarded by the post office due to bad addresses. The biggest problem has been with licensees on inactive status, because there is no brokerage associated with the license and we only have a home address. Thank you for your help to make sure your contact information is kept current at all times.

By the way, if you have had a **legal name change**, the same 10-day requirement applies to notify the Commission. For a name change, go to the website and print out a **Notice of Change** form. Fax or e-mail it to us with proof of the name change (court documents, marriage license, etc.) It could be considered a misleading advertisement if you conduct real estate business under a name that is different from the name on your license.

Please be patient with us while we work to make the site more user friendly, and please let us know if you have questions or suggestions about the website. Have you encountered **short sale** or other **lending fraud** in one of your transactions? Does something "smell" funny, or do you have questions about a particular practice? Contact the Commission by phone or e-mail at info@irec.idaho.gov to inquire or let us know about it. Even if a licensee is not involved, we will make sure the information is transmitted to the correct agency for follow-up. Loan fraud hurts our economy, our real estate markets, and our profession, and together we can make a difference!

The fee for a license exam increased to \$85 on November 15, 2010, pursuant to the terms of the 4-year contract executed with Pearson VUE in 2008.
